Enhance your digital photography skills and learn how to communicate more effectively with your camera. This workshop is designed to take you to the next level and further your knowledge of lighting, exposure and focal length to help you create stronger compositions. The emphasis will be on artistry rather than on technique, but you should have basic knowledge of your camera's exposure and focus settings beforehand. Take-home notes are provided.

Topics Covered:

Lighting & Exposure: how available light and your camera's exposure settings can be used to control brightness, mood and emphasis in your photographs.

Focal Length: how lenses (from wide-angle to telephoto) influence the perceived relationships between visual elements, and how this can be used to create perspective and a sense of space, inclusion or exclusion, clarity and focus in your picture.

Composition: how to use visual design elements and their arrangement in the frame to communicate your intended story, idea, mood or other message.
